

HIM OVER AND WELL

HEALTH Hatred comes from the heart; contempt from the head; and neither feeling is quite within our control.



HOW DOES "WORKS" FIT WITH, "WHOSOEVER SHALL CALL UPON THE NAME OF THE LORD SHALL BE SAVED?"

This quotation is found in Acts 2:21 and Romans 10:13. Many people quote these verses in an attempt to "prove" that all one has to do to be saved is simply say "Lord save me," or say "come into my heart and be my personal savior." But there is far more involved than simply saying these words. You will be lost if that is all you do!

To "call upon the name of the Lord" is to call upon him by doing—obeying—what he commands. The phrase is a figure of speech (synecdoche) implying all that one must do to be a disciple of the Lord. When the people on Pentecost cried out "what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37), they were asking, "how shall we call upon the name of the Lord and be saved?" Peter describes what is involved in calling on the Lord's name in Acts 2:38, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins." Both repenting and being baptized are done "in the name of Jesus Christ" i.e., by his authority. This is what Saul of Tarsus was commanded to do in order to have forgiveness of sins. "Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). He was to obey the Gospel by repenting of his sins and being baptized for the forgiveness of his sins, "calling on the name of the Lord." This was the process by which he called upon the Lord (i.e., obedience).

The context of Romans 10:13 makes it plain that in order to "call upon the name of the Lord," both "hearing" the Gospel and "obeying" the Gospel are involved. "But they have not all obeyed the gospel" (v.16), i.e., they have not all "called upon the name of the Lord."

Every act of obedience: faith (John 8:24), repentance (Acts 2:38), confession (Romans 10:10), and water baptism (Mark 16:16), is performed "calling on the name of the Lord." From the very moment we believe until the day we depart this earth, we call upon the name of the Lord (1 Cor. 1:2; 2 Tim. 2:19). We must, by faith, obey his word. His name is to be recognized in every act we perform (Col. 3:17). In so doing we are "calling upon his name."
